BREAKING DOWN BARRIERS: THE STRUGGLE FOR FAIR NHS HEALTHCARE FOR PEOPLE WITH LEARNING DISABILITIES

Accessing fair healthcare is a basic right, but for people with learning disabilities, navigating the NHS is often difficult. Complex processes, communication barriers, and misunderstandings lead to delayed treatments, inadequate care, or denial of services, worsening health conditions and increasing distress.

Discrimination is common, with healthcare providers often misunderstanding or underestimating their needs, resulting in a lack of appropriate adjustments and support. This leaves them more vulnerable and likely to suffer from preventable conditions.

A Story of Determination: Heaton Vale's Relentless Advocacy

Despite these challenges, the team at Heaton Vale fought tirelessly to secure necessary investigations under general anaesthetic for an individual. Their journey was filled by delays and misunderstandings, but their persistence paid off.



Abbey Jenkins, a PBS practitioner, played a crucial role by gathering data and creating reports to highlight the urgency. When the individual faced a 52-week wait, Nelia Silva, Associate Registered Manager, escalated the issue to the safeguarding team, who quickly provided support. Community Nurse Sarah Hood offered guidance and represented the individual at key meetings, ensuring all necessary investigations were done under anaesthetic to avoid repeat procedures.

The team encountered numerous obstacles, including new healthcare professionals unfamiliar with the case and missing notes. Despite this, they found compassionate hospital staff who understood the situation and made necessary adjustments to minimise risks.

A Lesson in Advocacy and Persistence

The success of this effort was a collaborative achievement, involving dedication from many individuals. Famous Osiboko, Franklin Okonkwo, John Sleigh, Lisa Williamson and Thomas Renshaw were key people who brought light to this situation. Staff showed great flexibility, rearranging shifts and using their skills to ensure everything ran smoothly, even resolving last-minute issues with missing paperwork.

Promote Parity, Champion diversity & challenge inequality

Heaton Vale's story highlights the power of persistence and advocacy. It proves that dedicated teams can make a difference by refusing to accept "no." This isn't just a victory but a call for a more inclusive healthcare system for people with learning disabilities.





Paris is a big Taylor Swift fan - she loves dancing to her favourite songs. She's also enjoying exploring the farmland and saying hello to the horses.










INTERVIEW WITH DERRION OUR NEW HEALTH & SAFETY OFFICER



Derrion talks to Phillip about his roles and responsibilities as City Care's Health & Safety Officer at Yew Tree Community Hub!

Phillip: I hear that you have got a new job. Can you tell me what it is?

Derrion: I'm the Health and Safety Officer.

Phillip: That's Brilliant. Did you apply for that job?

Derrion: Yes, I like to help people.

Phillip: Fantastic. As a Health and Safety Officer, you are going to be able to help people. You work on a Wednesday, what do you have to do?

Derrion: I clock in when I get there, I get my file folder. It's got my list of jobs I tick off, then I check the sensory room. I have to turn on the lights in the sensory room so everyone's safe.


Aligning with Global and Local Goals

City Care are proudly aligning with the United Nations' Race to Zero campaign, a global initiative aimed at achieving net-zero carbon emissions, and are fully committed to embracing new strategies and methods to support this. In support also of Manchester's ambitious goal to achieve zero carbon by 2038, we are fully committed to making meaningful changes in how we work.

To achieve these objectives, we've partnered with The Carbon Sea Garden and their visionary CEO, Vinnie Waldock to develop a comprehensive carbon reduction strategy tailored to our needs. Vinnie and his team are at the forefront of this initiative, offering their expertise to guide us through the process and there will be more insights from Vinnie in future editions, as we continue to share our progress.

We are setting ambitious targets to reduce our emissions by 4-5% each year. Our initial focus includes reducing fuel use in heating, vehicles, and air conditioning, and lowering electricity consumption across all our services.

In addition to our carbon reduction efforts, we are determined to eliminate Avoidable Single Use Plastics (A-SUP) from our operations. Our approach includes closely monitoring our current plastic usage and setting clear reduction targets.
